Campbell has been with the department for just over 13 years, and a police officer for 20. In that time he's worked in several capacities with local law enforcement agencies, starting in corrections and working as a member of the Calhoun-Cleburne Drug Task Force, a SWAT team member with the Calhoun County Sheriff's Office and as an investigator with the Jacksonville police, among other roles here.

"I've worked in some great places, but I really enjoy the community here and the people I work with," Campbell said, when asked why he chose to spend the majority of his career here.

It makes sense that he finds value in community; a big part of his decision to become a police officer came from a passion for helping and serving others.

"I wanted to be that guy who defends people that can't defend themselves," Campbell said.
